HERSTORY

- In early 90's, Don Severino de las Alas Agricultural College (DSAC) was already actively involved in Gender and Development as GAD Representative to Southern Tagalog Agriculture Resources Research and Development Consortium (STARRDEC).
- In 2008, STARRDEC was housed in Cavite State University and both the CvSU GAD Representative and GAD Coordinator of STARRDEC worked together in promoting gender equality (OP Memo No. 2, s. 2008).
- In 2012, The GAD Focal Point System (GAD-FPS) of the university headed by a chair was established through OP Memo No.46, s. 2012.
- The Office of the GAD-FPS was housed at Hostel Tropicana in 2013 through OP Memo No. 69, s. 2013.
- In 2015, the structure and composition of the GAD-FPS headed by a Director was approved by the Board of Regents through BOR Resolution No. 64, s. 2015 and OP Memo No. 12, s. 2016.
- On December 9, 2015, the University was awarded as the Most Outstanding State University in GAD Implementation in Calabarzon in 2014 by the National Economic and Development Authority, Regional Development Council, Calabarzon.

As of first semester, 2015-2016, the University had a total enrollment of 19,424 male and 24,246 female students or a total of 43,670. Female comprised 56 percent of the total enrollment while male constituted 44 percent.

The College of Engineering and Information Technology contributed the highest enrolment of 5,687 (13%), followed by CvSU-Imus Campus with 5,349 enrolees (12%), and CvSU-Silang Campus with 4,571 enrolees (10%).

The CvSU-Tanza Campus shared the lowest enrollment of 255.

WOMEN IN EDUCATION




Figure 1: Enrolment in the College of Arts and Sciences




Figure 2: Enrolment in the College of Education




Figure 3: Enrolment in the College of Economics, Management and Development Studies




Figure 4: Enrolment in the College of Nursing

Most of the courses offered in the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) (Figure 1), College of Education (CEd) (Figure 2), College of Economics, Management, and Development Studies (CEMDS) (Figure 3), and College of Nursing (CON) (Figure 4) were female-dominated except for Diploma in Hotel & Restaurant Management in CEd.




Figure 5: Enrolment in the College of Criminal Justice




Figure 6: Enrolment in the College of Sports, Physical Education and Recreation




Figure 7: Enrolment in the College of Engineering and Information Technology
