



Gender Mainstreaming in the University

Gender mainstreaming in the university is evident in its policies, people, enabling mechanisms, and programs, projects, and activities.

Policies. The university supports the international and national legal mandates on GAD. Local policies on GAD which were approved by the Board of Regents are being implemented to mainstream GAD in the University such as: Declaration of 2nd Thursday of March as Women's Day in CvSU, Declaration of the 1st Monday of December as Day of Support to the 18-Day Campaign to End VAW in CvSU, Strengthening and Institutionalization of the CvSU GAD Focal Point System, and IRR of RA 7877.

People. The GAD Focal Point System of the University is headed by President Divinia C. Chavez from January 2012 to August 2016 and President Hernando D. Robles from October-December 2016. The GAD-FPS has an executive committee composed of four vice presidents and a GAD Focal Committee headed by a director.



Enabling mechanisms. The University maintains linkages with other agencies. It continuously coordinates and communicates with the Philippine Commission on Women, Commission on Higher Education, National Economic and Development Authority, State Universities and Colleges, Local Government Units, Local Water Districts, and other agencies in the province. The University maintains a sex-disaggregated data of the university officials and students and consistently provides budget allocation for its GAD related activities.

Programs, projects, and activities. The programs, projects, and activities of the University are focused on four major final outputs: higher education services, research services, extension services, and support to operation. The University is able to duplicate its feat of being the 2014 Most Outstanding State University in Gender and Development Implementation in CALABARZON.

As of first semester, 2016, the University had a total enrollment of 16,550 male and 20,246 female students or a total of 36,796. Female comprised 55 percent of the total enrollment while male constituted 45 percent. The CvSU-Imus Campus contributed the highest enrollment of 4,875 (13%), followed by the College of Engineering and Information Technology with 4,578 enrollees (12%), and CvSU-Silang Campus with 4,042 enrollees (11%). The CvSU-Tanza Campus shared the lowest enrollment of 206.

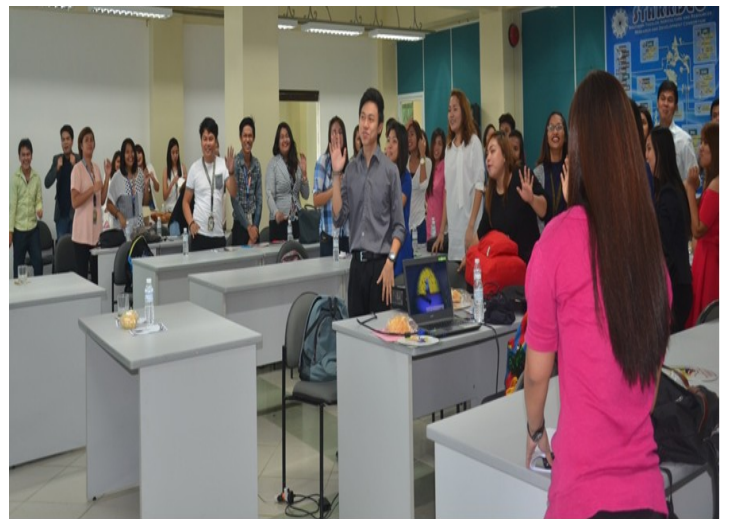
