I. INSTITUTIONAL PLANNING

A. YEAR-END REVIEW

The Office of the Vice President for Planning and Development (OVPPD) facilitated the University's Year-End Review on January 7 at the Santiago M. Rolle Hall. President Robles highlighted the accomplishments of targets for FY 2018. The vice presidents presented the accomplishments of their respective offices in terms of Major Final Outputs/Programs. Stakeholders shared comments and suggestions as inputs to the operational planning workshop.



B. OPERATIONAL PLANNING WORKSHOP

The Administrative Council finalized the office targets on MFOs and discussed the issues and concerns about the FY 2019 targets on January 8 at the Crown Legacy Hotel in Baguio City. After the workshop, the group visited Benguet State University on January 9 for benchmarking of good practices on instruction, research, extension and production.





C. SETTING OF UNIVERSITY TARGETS FOR FY 2020

The vice presidents and heads of offices concerned convened on April 29 at the S.L. Lasap Hall to finalize the University Targets on the Major Final Outputs for FY 2020.



D. OPERATIONAL PLANNING WORKSHOP FOR FY 2020

Members of the Administrative Council convened on September 13 at the Hostel Tropicana for a planning workshop regarding the university targets for FY 2020. Operational plans, which are outputs from the workshop, could be translated later into OPCRs.





E. SETTING OF QUARTERLY TARGETS FOR FY 2020

On October 30, vice presidents and heads of the offices concerned met at the Hostel Tropicana to deliberate and decide on the university's quarterly targets for 2020.



II. PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT

The Team met six times (March 18, April 24, May 2, 7 and 27, and September 9) and reviewed the Strategic Performance Management System Manual. The proposed revisions will be presented to the Administrative Council for deliberation and approval.



III. MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

A. NORMATIVE FINANCING WORKSHOP

On September 10 at the S. L. Lasap Hall, a re-orientation was conducted for the offices concerned regarding the collection of higher education data for AY 2019 – 2020 through the CHED Electronic Collection and Knowledge System (CHECKS).



B. UNIVERSITY INFORMATION SYSTEMS

The following are the improvements and updates made by the MIS Unit on various university information systems:



CEIT Queuing System

The system was facilitated during pre-registration periods – January and August.







Created to accommodate encoding of students information for easier integration to the existing enrollment system (May to June).

Human Resource Information System

Adjustments were made to DTR settings:

- Leave, holidays, early-outs, etc. (February to April).
- Accommodation of flexi schedules (September to October).

Student Internship Program in the Philippines

First version was pilot-tested by student interns from the Department of Information Technology (July).





University Website

Improvements on the contents such as: list of subjects and enrollees, list of available slots were displayed, status of students whether assessed or validated were shown (August).

Student Portal

Reset for student accounts and forgot password features were implemented to accommodate students enjoying free education. Adjustments were made since receipts were no longer issued (November).


Online Student Admission System

E. ADDITIONAL E-MAIL ACCOUNTS CREATED


Forty (40) faculty and/or staff requested for the creation of their university e-mail accounts which were generated by the MIS unit.

A. UPDATE ON THE QMS OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

C. REFRESHER ON ISO 9001:2015

On April 4 at the International House 1 Basement Function Hall, members of the Administrative Council in the Main Campus, core team, auditors and secretariat were re-oriented on the standards of a Quality Management System. Ms. Lolita G. Herrera, IQA Team Leader served as the resource speaker.





D. ORIENTATION ON WORKPLACE STANDARDS

The 5S of Good Housekeeping, the University's procedure on building maintenance and job requests, and the workplace standards proposed by the QMS Core Team were presented during the orientation on April 11 at the International House 2 Conference Room. Topics were conversed by Dr. David L. Cero, Prof. Danielito R. Escaño and Dr. Leyma L. Cero, respectively.



E. REFRESHER ON AUDITING QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

On April 25 at Hostel Tropicana, the internal quality auditors of the University attended a re-orientation on the principles of auditing and the approved IQA procedure. This is in preparation for the internal audit that will be performed on the different offices within the campus on May. Dr. Ruel M. Mojica and Ms. Lolita G. Herrera, former and present IQA Team Leaders, respectively, managed the orientation proper.




F. INTERNAL QUALITY AUDIT


From May 14 to 16, an internal quality audit was performed within the different offices of the University. Internal quality auditors reviewed the procedures being implemented by their assigned audit areas and checked the presence of corresponding evidences. After thorough deliberation, 1,167 conformities (Cs), 203 opportunities for improvement (OFIs), and 18 non-conformities (NCs) were found. Correction and corrective action reports (CCARs) were later then issued to the offices with identified NCs.



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G. MIDYEAR MANAGEMENT REVIEW

During the Midyear Management Review on July 24 at the S. L. Lasap Hall, the Administrative Council and QMS Core Team assessed opportunities for the continual improvement of the University's Quality Management System.





H. SURVEILLANCE AUDIT

Five auditors from SOCOTEC Certification Philippines, Inc. (formerly AJA Registrars) came for a surveillance audit on October 7. The activity aimed to maintain confidence that the certified management system continues to fulfil requirements. The audit team recommended CvSU's certification maintenance.

A. PROJECT WIPE: FIXED-POINT PHOTOGRAPHY

The 5S Core Team conducted the fixed-point photography on October 8 – 9. Photo documentations will serve as baseline data in preparation for the 5S Good Housekeeping activities and formulation of Quality Workplace Standards for adoption and implementation in the university.

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
