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Change has come! CvSU implements REFORM

As per Board Resolution No. 58, s. 2017, the CvSU Research and Extension Framework, Organizational Structure, Road Map and Agenda, known as REFORM, was approved and is already being implemented in the University.

The said program aims to unify the research and extension efforts of the institution and reorganize the different divisions under its major units. The new name Office of the Vice President for Research and Extension (OVPRE) replaced the former name Office of the Vice President for Research, Extension, Continuing Education and Training Services (OVPRECETS).

To facilitate the management of the database and the dissemination of information essential to the operations, a new center was also established. Along with the Research Center and the Extension Services is the Knowledge Management Center (KMC) which will handle the Publications and Communication Office, and the Intellectual Property Management Office. KMC created

Through BOR Resolution No. 58, s. 2017 approved on September 15, 2017, Cavite State University created the Knowledge Management Center (KMC) under the Office of the Vice President for Research and Extension (OVPRE).

The Center's main function is to coordinate with other units in the promotion of research and extension culture in the University. It aims to capture and use knowledge as a link to protect the discoveries of the researchers, faculty, and students for the benefit of the University and the community. Specifically, the KMC aims to disseminate research information and technologies to target clientele through publications of journals, newsletter, occasional paper, techno-guides, and the like; protect the discoveries and technology innovations of the researchers, faculty, and students; and facilitate the provision of patent and publication incentives to qualified faculty members and staff. VP for R&E joins LIF 4 program

With the goal of converting research into marketable products and services, Dr. Ruel M. Mojica, Vice President for Research and Extension, participated in the Leaders in Innovation (Batch 4) Fellowship Program (LIF 4).

The Department of Science and Technology, in partnership with the British Royale Academy of Engineering and the Asian Institute of Management (AIM), conducted the said program to train selected participants on business innovation, intellectual property, business model, negotiation skills and pitching.

A total of 45 participants, including those from Indonesia and Thailand, joined the two-week residential training at Hoxton Hotel, Shoreditch, London, United Kingdom from January 15 to 26. Meanwhile, the roadmap emphasizes the goals of the University in terms of R & E. As the university envisions to be a research university in 2022, it is guided by its target each year: Year of Empowerment (2017); Year of Quality Performance (2018-2019); Year of Recognition (2020); Year of Internationalization (2021); and Year of Excellence (2022).

For the R & E agenda, five thematic areas were identified: Agri-Fisheries and Food Security; Biodiversity and Environmental Conservation; Smart Engineering, ICT and Industrial Competitiveness; Social Development and Equality; and Public Health and Welfare.

OVPRE believes that the said modifications are "essential towards the enhancement and promotion of a healthy research and extension culture in the University". (LAOrsal)
