The College of Nursing (CON) Research and Development Unit participated in the inter-campus and colleges Gender and Development Completed Research Competition held at the International House I last June 15, sponsored by the CvSU Gender and Development (GAD) Research Committee. The invitation to join this competition was circulated to all colleges and campuses in the entire CvSU System through the efforts of the GAD Unit. From all entries in the said forum, CON's completed research entitled **“Unravelling Prenatal Experiences of Incarcerated Women Ages 23 to 35 in Correctional Institution for Women”** emerged as the **Best Completed Research**.

This study was completed in March 2017 and presented by Mr. Alwie A. Torente, a registered nurse and co-authored by Joshua Emmanuelle Laguidao RN, Unikutelle Libby Harry, and Prof. Nenita B. Panaligan. The awarding ceremony was witnessed by the GAD Regional Coordinator, CvSU GAD Director, Dr. Nelia C. Cresino, the panel of judges with invited members from GAD Regional Office, and other CvSU faculty, researchers, alumni and students. 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CvSU-Imus extends HELP to BJMP

In line with the implementation of “Gabay Kabuhayan Para Sa Kaunlaran Program” (GKKP) as per Board Resolution No. 11 Series of 2015, the Department of Social Sciences and Humanities (DSSH) of Cavite State University (CvSU) Imus City Campus conducted an extension program for the Bureau of Jail and Management Penology (BJMP) in Imus City from October 10, 2017 to April 24, 2018.

The program entitled *Holistic Expansive Lifeguard Program (HELP)* developed by Ms. Mary Grace L. Descarga, headed by Ms. Diwata R. Parong, the Department Extension Coordinator in coordination with the campus RDE, Mr. Nicasio I. Saavedra Jr. was composed of 12 modules and conducted for 12 weeks with 50 detainees as participants. The program had the goals of improving the self-regulation of detainees that can help them to cope with adverse circumstances and to transform the skills needed for adapting with life’s situation. The said program was facilitated by third year Psychology students enrolled in PSYC 111: Group Dynamics and was supervised by the instructors from the DSSH.

Some of the detainees express gratitude for the said program. “*Ang ganda ng ginagawa nyo, maraming salamat kasi napadalaw kayo rito... Nawawala yung lungkot namin, Ma’am,*” said by one of the participants. The students were

thankful as well for the experience this extension service has given them. “*Pinararamdam sa amin ng gawaing ito na kahit malaki man o maliit ang aming nagagawa, kapag nakita namin ang kanilang mga ngiti at kapag nalalaman namin na may natutunan sila mula sa amin ay gumagaan ang aming pakiramdam,*” said Lovely Anne Balanay, one of the student facilitators of the program. This kind of program will still be pursued for the coming semesters for the benefit of the mental wellness and coping behaviour of the detainees in BJMP-Imus City. (DRParong)

Selected faculty and staff from colleges and campuses participated in the activity. On the first day of the training-workshop, Dr. Alimboyoguen lectured on selecting a journal for publishing a paper. According to her, an author may choose to publish on any type of journal but give preference to international peer reviewed and scholarly journals like ISI journals. A refereed journal is considered scholarly if it has passed the criteria of Thomson Reuters or known as ISI (Institute of Scientific Information now Thomson Reuters Web of Science) which is the largest database publishing house that covers all fields of studies. Also, an author must consider the following: scope of the journal selected, the reader of the paper and cost of publishing. Meanwhile, Dr. Ma. Cynthia R. dela Cruz, Director for Research, talked on how to make the introduction which must be short and focused. A good introduction makes the reader understand why the study was done, explain why the paper is interesting, set up the problem and give a very brief idea about what is discovered in the paper but does not include results. A workshop on preparing an introduction was conducted and evaluation was done afterwards.

Dr. Lily Ann D. Lando, OIC/Interim Director and Research Lead of WORLD FISH Philippine Country Office, was the resource person on the second and third days of the training-workshop. She tackled several topics such as: Introduction to technical writing which includes the steps in the writing process from prewriting to the final draft; writing for publication that tackles the preparation of tables, graphs and use of photos, writing the methods and results of the study, writing the discussion and making a conclusion, make a compelling introduction, writing the abstract, composing the title of the article, selecting keywords, and preparing acknowledgments and references/literature cited.

Exercises were conducted after each topic and workshop for the final output of each participant followed. The papers were evaluated by Dr. Lando and were forwarded to KMC at the end of the activity for possible publication. (MBEugenio)

CvSU faculty attend 4th PCHRD – Region IV research forum

Faculty members of the College of Nursing (CON) attended the 4th Multidisciplinary Research Forum of the Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD) Region IV Consortium held at the Centennial Hall, De La Salle University, Dasmariñas City on June 13, 2018. The research forum aimed to search for the best research study for undergraduate and professional categories in the region which can be recommended for the National level competition as part of PCHRD's founding anniversary celebration. Participants were from the 16 member institutions in the CaLaBaRZon region. In the recently held regional forum, Prof. Nenita B. Panaligan, past-designate Research Coordinator of the College of Nursing and the former CvSU Chairperson of the Ethics Review Board (CY 2017), served as one of the judges in both categories of the competition.

Since 2014, Cavite State University has been recognized as one of the 16 member institutions in Region IV with Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with PCHRD. PCHRD is one of the three sectoral councils of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), a forward-looking, partnership-based national body responsible for coordinating and monitoring research activities in the country. It is mandated to perform the following functions: formulate policies, plans, programs, project, and strategies for health S&T development; program and allocate government and external funds for R&D; monitor R&D projects; and generate external funds. The Sugar Palm Research, Information and Trade (SPRINT) Center recently facilitated the On-the-Job Training of five BS Forestry students of the UPLB College of Forestry and Natural Resources. The training spanned one month (June 14-July 14, 2018) and was done at Queentown Farm, Brgy. Tambo Malaki, Indang, Cavite.

The training consisted of lectures, demonstrations and hands-on experiences in kaong seedling production, sap tapping, syrup and sugar making, vinegar production, yunot harvesting and rope making. Aside from these, the students conducted data gathering through actual observation, focus group discussion and key informant interviews. Such were part of their individual and group research projects along various aspects of kaong production and post-production.

The activity was capped by a presentation of the students' preliminary outputs to their respective advisers and representatives from SPRINT and Queentown Farm. (JLBHerrera)
