Cavite. The training was conducted in line with the purchase of 30 IBM SPSS Software licenses distributed to various units, colleges and satellite campuses.





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CAS holds 7th Students' Research Forum, 10th Annual In-House Review

The College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), headed by Dr. Bettina Joyce P. Ilagan, held its 7th Students' Research Forum and 10th Annual In-House Review on February 28 and March 1, respectively, at S. M. Rolle Hall, Cavite State University.

The 7th CAS Students' Forum showcased remarkable undergraduate theses and researches of nine CAS students and alumni. This was divided into two categories: the Experimental Research Category and the Social Science Research Category.

National High School); BA Journalism students, namely: Joshua G. Ganoy and Alex Nicole V. Salvador (Proposed Program Formats Functions for the Campus Based-Community Radio Station in Cavite State University); Cherianth Jearim R. Agripa, BS Social Work student (Situation of Senior Citizen Inmates and their Perceived Efficacy on the Program and Services in the Correctional Institution for Women: Basis for Social Work Intervention); BS Psychology students, namely: Erwin T. Asplico, Vince Jayvee P. Baring, and Hyacinth O. Toledo (Counterfactual Thoughts, Risk Perception, and Earthquake Preparedness of Families from Barangay Mabuhay, Carmona, Cavite); and Rebecca Mendoza, BA Political Science student (Role of

Information Technology in Good Governance of Selected Barangays of Dasmarinas, Cavite).

John Rex N. Baldomero grabbed the Best Paper Award under the Experimental Research Category while Erwin T. Asplico, Vince Jayvee P. Baring, and Hyacinth O. Toledo got the Best Paper Award for the Social Science Research Category. The activity was made possible through the expertise of the panel of evaluators, Dr. Rhodora S. Crizaldo, Engr. Orlando B. delos Reyes, Dr. Paulito Hilario, and Dr. Miriam D. Baltazar.

Meanwhile, the 10th CAS In-House Review began with the presentation of five extension papers and four research papers. Ms. Liwayway P. Taglinao presented the extension paper titled "Building Communities, Improving Health, and Optimizing the Environment" while Prof. Michele T. Bono talked on the journey of their project titled "CAS Bee". Ms. Merlie C. Nahilat explained the scope of "Social Organization through Comprehensive Services and Community Intervention" while Ms. Ruby A. Manaig elaborated the contents of "Developing Language and Media-Literate Communities". The last paper presenter was Mr. Andrew J. Siducon who talked on "Developing a Progressive Society through Mathematics and Allied Sciences".

An open forum was held after the presentations of extension papers. This was followed by the presentation of four research papers. Ms. Arleen C. Panaligan presented her dissertation titled "DNA Barcode matK Effectively Distinguishes the Commercially Cultivated Coffee Species in the Philippines" while Dr. Manny A. Romeroso explained his paper titled "Language Learning Strategies and Communication Competence among BSE-English Students at the Cavite State University: a Basis for a Proposed Enhancement Program". Ms. Jezreel C. Del Espiritu Santo talked on *A Study of Children with Incarcerated Parents towards the Development of Community-Based Psychosocial Support Activities*. Lastly, Mr. Paul Vincent Botin explained his study titled "Alternative Proof of Frullani Integral and its Consequences".

Faculty and students of the College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Languages and Mass Communication (CAS-DLMC) presented their research papers at the Linguistic Society of the Philippines International Conference (LSPIC) held at the De La Salle University, Manila on March 7-9, 2019. Aiming to highlight the state of linguistic research in the Philippines over the past 50 years, the said conference was organized by the Linguistic Society of the Philippines in coordination with the Br. Andrew Gonzalez FSC College of Education, De La Salle University (BAGCED-DLSU) in celebration of its 50th anniversary with the theme: "LSP@50: Celebrating the Golden Era of Linguistics in the Philippines".

Among the faculty members of CAS-DLMC who presented their research papers were Prof. Catherine R. Mojica, Prof. Bernard S. Feranil, and Dr. Agnes C. Francisco. Student presenters include Rachel Anne G. Maglalang and Reymar C. Monreal (BA English 4-1). Meanwhile, Japhet Manzano (BSE-English 4-1) and Mr. Kent Bryan Colocado (graduate of BSE-English) from the CvSU-College of Education presented their papers with Prof. Mojica and Dr. Francisco as research advisers, respectively.

The well-attended three-day conference provided venue for linguists, researchers, language educators, and students from the Philippines and other countries to share and discuss trends, issues as well as innovations pertaining to linguistics and language education. Other highlights include keynote lectures, panel discussions, workshops, plenary lectures, poster

CCJ attends earthquake resilience convening workshop

The College of Criminal Justice (CCJ) attended a two-day convening workshop on earthquake resilience and response, the third of a series of workshops, on March 21-22, 2019 at The Legend Villas, Mandaluyong City. The activity was hosted by the Center for Disaster Preparedness (CDP) in partnership with Asia Disaster Reduction and Response Network (ADRRN) and ELRHA's Humanitarian Innovation Fund (HIF). It was supported by the Asian Preparedness Partnership composed of the Office of the Civil Defense and Philippine Preparedness Partnership. The workshop brought together various participants from the academe, government and private sectors with the goal of investigating unsolved problems in earthquake resilience and response in the Greater Metro Manila Area, identifying potential solutions and forging partnerships between the participants.

During the first activity conducted in December 2018, eight innovation teams were formed, namely: hazard mapping, evacuation routes, soil liquefaction, earthquake detector, awareness raising, contingency planning, *(continue on page 4)*

presentations and general meeting of the Society. Dr. Edgar W. Dita (De La Salle University, Manila & past president of Linguistic Society of the Philippines), and Dr. Marilu R. Madrunio (University of Santo Tomas) were plenary speakers focusing on the theme, "Linguistics in Asia: Current Situation and Future Directions".

management of the dead and the missing, and beyond plan preparation. Each team had three members assigned to identify a problem or situation. The Awareness Raising team members consisted of CvSU CCJ faculty, namely: Dr. Susan G. Tan, Dr. Famela Iza Cabe-Matic and Ms. Silkie C. Taguinay. A budget of P16,000.00 was given to each team to carry out initial research on the problems identified.

The second workshop was conducted on February 19-21 where the innovation teams presented updates and feedback on the progress of their researches, problems encountered and solutions, and things learned from their initial data gathering. From this sharing of ideas, the teams started mapping out what the potential solution might look like in reality.

Meanwhile, Ikue Uchida, Innovation Coordinator of ADRRN, discussed the Social Business Model Canvas to help the teams align their projects with the needs of external partners, stakeholders, and the society in general.

All innovation teams presented their respective proposal to various organizations in the country like Balik-lokal, DRRNet-Philippines, Humanitarian Actors as Best Innovators (HABI), Kapwa Ko Mahal Ko Foundation, Department of the Interior and


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an extension program.

The ES Center continues to strive in improving its extension system and processes while assisting the implementers, particularly the faculty and staff involved in extension activities. Several activities have already been conducted starting with the alignment of the extension programs/ projects to the banner Extension Program of the University "Poverty Alleviation Program through Ugnayan 2.0 Approach"; formulation of community and training needs assessment instruments; and preparation, submission and presentation of extension proposals.
