



CvSU participates in Project HUGIS-GIS Training

Cavite State University (CvSU) participated in the Geographic Information System (GIS) training using Quantum GIS (QGIS) hosted by the Batangas State University (BatSU) last August 19-20 via Google Meet. Twenty faculty members, researchers, and staff from the College of Agriculture, Food, Environment, and Natural Resources (CAFENR) and College of Engineering and Information Technology (CEIT) attended the two-day training.

The said training included basic knowledge and practical understanding of GIS concepts and application with topics on familiarization of Quantum GIS (QGIS), map projection, base

maps, digitization, geo-referencing of earth imagery, topographic mapping, and map layout. Participants from different state universities and colleges (SUCs) presented their outputs.

The GIS training was part of the capacity building of the project titled “Harmonized and Unified GIS for Industry Productivity (HUGIS)”, a collaborative project between BatSU and different SUCs including CvSU, Central Mindanao State University, Eastern Samar State University, Laguna State Polytechnic University, Mindoro State University, Romblon State University, and Tarlac Agricultural University. CvSU-CCAT Campus continues to hold two research webinars

With its goal of providing continuous quality services, CvSU -CCAT Campus Research and Extension (R&E) Office held the 6th and 7th episodes of their research webinar series last July 22 and August 19, respectively.

The 6th episode was held with the theme, “*Managing Government Projects*,” via Cisco Webex and Facebook live. Ms. Antonette M. Tirona-Torres, senior consultant of Sillupo Consulting Inc. who specializes in Urban and Regional Planning, was invited as its resource speaker. She shared her knowledge and experiences in handling, managing, and strategizing projects from local to international institutions. Likewise, she shared her expertise as a practitioner in understanding how project life cycle flows within a specific team, the risks involved, and the ways on how to manage, close, and operate different projects.

Elaborating her topic on Project Management Simplified, Ms. Torres, who is also known to be an experienced project manager in the Philippine government, discussed the importance of Portfolio, Program, Project Management (PPP) Hierarchy in strategizing and executing projects. She mentioned that the PPP Hierarchy could be used in managing projects through some Project Management Frameworks. She also introduced the phases and the life cycle of project management.

“One to four (1-4) of the phases is part of the project management (Initiation, Planning, Execution and Control, and Closeout) including operation (fifth phase) so that you can integrate it in the initiation and planning phase,” Ms. Torres pointed out.

She further emphasized the role of project managers and a team, their qualities that may contribute to a successful completion of a project, and the ways on how to mitigate some of the risks that were present or may arise through time.

Ms. Torres said, *“When it comes to attitude, I’m looking for somebody who is a team player, participative, highly productive, skillful based on the roles to play, and knowledgeable. All projects have risks and a project manager has to know when to evaluate and when to implement some risk mitigation authorities.”*

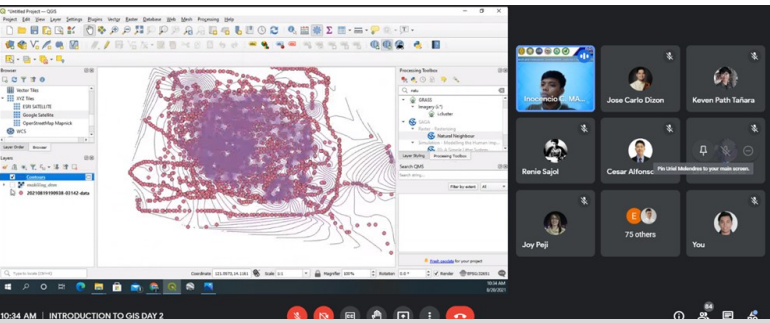

Engr. Gee Jay C. Bartolome, CvSU-CCAT R&E director, read the closing remarks of Dr. Camilo A. Polinga, vice president for Administrative and Support Services, and invited the participants to join another round of webinars for research and extension. Ms. Mary Ann E. Ignaco, faculty of the Department of Computer Studies, served as the moderator.

Meanwhile, the 7th episode titled, “*Leveraging Data with Impactful Infographics*” was held via Cisco Webex with Mr. John Lorenzo A. Yambot, an assistant professor in Statistics at the University of the Philippines - Los Baños, as the resource speaker. He discussed the importance of using infographics. He also mentioned the steps needed in designing infographics, the best practices in designing different visual models, and their effectiveness to the viewers.

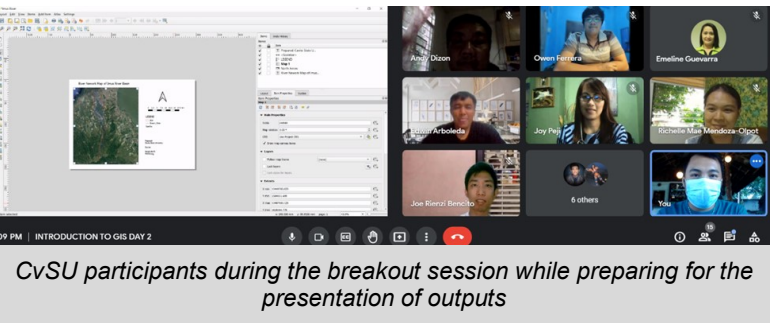

Overall, these two research episodes proved that learning should not stop despite the pandemic. (Michael M. Ramos Jr. and Mari Daisy O. Corral)

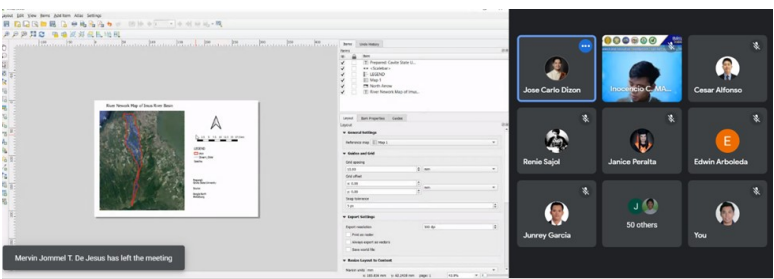

IQ audit team visits KMC

Members of the Internal Quality (IQ) audit team of the University led by Engr. Renato B. Cubilla, faculty of the College of Engineering and Information Technology (CEIT) and Dr. Bettina Joyce P. Ilagan, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), visited the Knowledge Management Center (KMC) last August 02 at the Innovation Technology Support Office (ITSO) conference room.

The Internal Quality audit aims to determine whether the approved procedures conform to the CvSU QMS requirements; ensure that the processes are effectively implemented and maintained, and identify areas for improvement.

Dr. Agnes C. Francisco, KMC director, and the KMC personnel were interviewed by the audit team. The Publication and Communications Division (PCD) was asked about the usual problems encountered in journal publication. Dr. Francisco mentioned that problems include limited submission of papers for publication and difficulty in searching for possible external reviewers per discipline . Engr. Cubilla suggested that data coming from all units be updated in the university website for proper dissemination.

Meanwhile, Engr. Sheryl D. Fenol, KTTO manager, presented all the documents of the Intellectual Property Management Division (IPMD). As suggested, a summary report of all the documents be properly filed to easily determine the number of patents, utility models, and copyrights. In addition, the team asked if the Quality Procedures have been reviewed because it is necessary to conduct a review once every three years. Dr. Francisco affirmed this as the Center did the review last March. After the verification of documents, the audit team visited the KMC office and discussed the results.

To wrap up the success of the audit, Dr. Francisco delivered the closing remarks and thanked the audit team for the recommendations given to the Center. *(Lester P. Adriano)*

Magcawas receives two awards from UPLB-CPAf

Dr. Almira G. Magcawas, director for CvSU Extension Services and faculty of the College of Economics, Management, and Development Studies (CEMDS), received awards from the University of the Philippines Los Baños, College of Public Affairs and Development (UPLB CPAf) during its 21st CPAf Recognition Rites as the college honored its 2021 graduates. With the theme, “*Expanding Horizons: CPAf Graduates as Ambassadors of Resilience and Inclusive Development*”, the ceremony was held last August 5 via Zoom and Facebook Live.

During the event, Dr. Magcawas was awarded the 2021 Best PhD Dissertation for her paper titled “Social Entrepreneurship as a Community Development Approach in Selected Coffee Farming Communities in the Philippines”. The said award is given annually to deserving graduates with outstanding research achievements and contributions to CPAf’s mission. Each candidate for this nomination should have a grade of 1.00 – 1.25 for his or her dissertation and be selected based on the following criteria: 25 percent for quality of science and theory, 25 percent for methodology, 20 percent for quality of writing, and 30 percent for contribution to discipline. A total of eight candidates were nominated for the said award.

In the same event, Dr. Magcawas was also recognized as 2021 Student Service Awardee, an award given to honor

OVPRE commits to accomplish targets for 2021

The four units under the Office of the Vice President for Research and Extension, namely: Research Center (RC), Extension Services (ES), National Coffee Research, Development and Extension Center (NCRDEC), and Knowledge Management Center (KMC) committed to accomplish the set targets for 2021. As the 2nd quarter ended, each unit reported its individual accomplishments.

Knowledge Management Center was consistent in its commitment to deliver services to both internal and external clients evident in its accomplishments which truly showed its management amidst the pandemic.

Through its Publication and Communication Division (PCD), 2019 and 2020 issues of the CvSU Research Journal, three monthly issues of REconnections and one quarterly issue of UGNAYAN newsletters were published; 13 publication incentive applications were processed and a total amount of Php 137,500.00 was released; eight plagiarism checking services were rendered; 51 author citations for 2021 on research publications were summarized, and an Asynchronous Writeshop on the Establishment of International Peer-Reviewed Journal was conducted. The Intellectual Property Management Division (IPMD) through the Innovations and Technology Support Office (ITSO) and Knowledge and Technology Transfer Office (KTTO) exerted best efforts in the promotion, commercialization, and protection of CvSU intellectual property assets through its partnership with various units, colleges, and campuses through the support of the Office of the Vice President for Research and Extension. ITSO conducted six webinars/activities, drafted 50 copyright applications, processed one trademark registration, obtained 10 copyright and one utility model certificates, and received four notices from IPOPHL. The KTTO had one technology submitted for FOB, made one technology licensing agreement, and four direct licensing term sheets.

Meanwhile, the University Extension Services attained its accomplishments through the collective efforts of different colleges, campuses, and other extension implementing units.

A total of 21 webinars were conducted by the University which were attended by 3,605 participants of whom 2,572 were female while 1,033 were male. Likewise, the Training and Courseware Development Division continued to

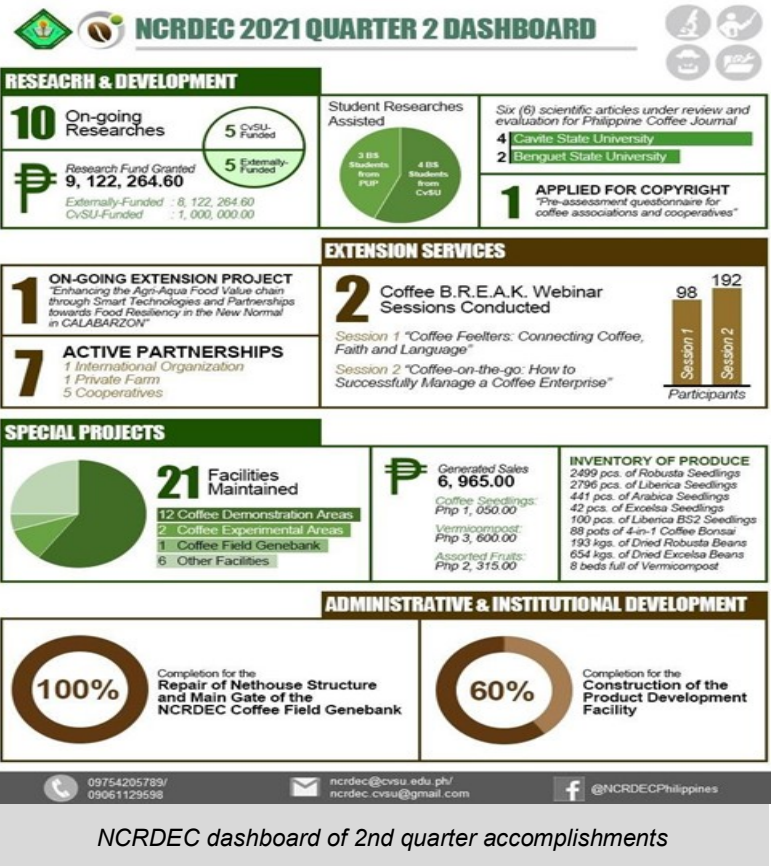
campuses, colleges, units, and Cavite FITS Centers by showcasing their products and other information, education, and communication (IEC) materials at the Technology and Innovation Hub of the CvSU Agri-Ecotourism Park. Furthermore, the Community Engagement and External Relations Division in its efforts of establishing partnerships facilitated the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the University and Terra Verde Eco-Farm, Inc. and collaborated with other units for the Covid-19 Donation Drive of the University wherein hot meals were given to San Jose Bahay Alima Foundation, Inc. in Carasuchi, Indang, Cavite and food packs were distributed to 40 households in Bancod (Quarry), Indang, Cavite. Aside from the continuous monitoring of extension projects and different extension activities of other colleges, campuses, and units, the Monitoring and Evaluation Division facilitated the granting of five Extension Programs of colleges/campuses. Regular quarterly meetings via zoom with the extension coordinators were also facilitated by the division in order to monitor status of the extension projects and activities of colleges, campuses and other RDE units. Lastly, the Technology Demonstration Farm Division led the improvement of the different areas of the Technology Demonstration Farm (TDF) in preparation for the launching of the Agri-Eco Tourism Park.

The Research Center, on the other hand, ushered its 2nd Research Proposal Review held last April 27 via Cisco Webex attended by 60 participants where 6 out of the 26 research proposals presented and evaluated, were endorsed for funding while the other proposals are on the process of revisions for endorsement in the next quarter. Also, designated faculty researchers showcased research outputs in international conferences, one at the SEAMEO Congress 2021 last April 28-29, one at the International Conference on Research Innovation and Investment last May 17-20, and two at the Association of Scientific Information on Coffee Conference (ASIC) on Coffee Science at Montpellier SupAgro in France last June 8-July 1. Four research outputs were published in ISI-indexed journals while six citations in articles published by other researchers in refereed journals and by book authors were also recognized. Three research studies were completed. Two of these were conducted by dedicated faculty members while one was conducted by the Center's research assistant. The Center also purchased new equipment such as UV Vis Spectrometer Microplate, Muffle Furnace, Sterilizing Oven, Water Purifier, Vacuum Drying Oven, Micropipette set and other laboratory equipment with a total of Php 6,587,741.40 to maintain and upgrade its facilities. Additionally, four externally-funded research projects were approved and commenced. Two of these projects were funded by ACDI/VOCA through PHILCAFE.

These projects were "Investigating the Role of Seedling Containers in the Plant Vigor of Coffee Seedlings Grown in the Nursery" and "Enhancing Coffee Quality Using Endogenous

Microorganisms in Arabica coffee fermentation". The other two projects were funded by DOST-PCIEERD under the program titled "Wet Processing Technology Through Microbial Fermentation for High-Quality Chocolates".

Lastly, the National Coffee Research, Development and Extension Center (NCRDEC), with its mandate to conduct relevant and cutting-edge researches for the development of the Philippine coffee industry, was granted two research and institutional development projects by ACDI/VOCA under its PhilCAFE Program in addition to its eight on-going researches of which, five were funded by the CvSU Research Grant and three were funded by DA-BAR, DA-BioTech and DOST CALABARZON. In addition, the Center's Coffee BREAK 2021 webinar series kicked-off and conducted two sessions covering the topics on coffee, faith, and language and management of coffee enterprise. Profiling/assessment of farmers and producer organizations, validation of assessment results and ceremonial MOA signing to 10 collaborating POs were conducted under the DOST-PCAARRD funded extension project titled "Enhancing the Agri-Aqua Food Value chain through Smart Technologies and Partnerships towards Food Resiliency in the New Normal in CALABARZON." The Center also assisted four studies of undergraduate students from Polytechnic University of the Philippines and Cavite State University. Moreover, a pre-assessment questionnaire for coffee associations and cooperatives was submitted to ITSO for copyright. The Philippine Coffee Journal (PCJ) was able to secure six (6) scientific articles from Benguet State University and Cavite State University which are currently under review and evaluation of the external reviewers and the editorial staff. For the continuous improvement of its existing service delivery system, renovation of the coffee field genebank was already completed, while the construction of the product development facility as one of the major components of the CvSU Agri-Eco Tourism Park is currently being conducted. CvSU provides technical assistance to Terra Verde Ecofarm

Mr. Junser P. Magpantay, faculty from the College of Agriculture, Food, Environment, and Natural Resources – Department of Forestry and Environmental Science (CAFENR-DFES), provided technical assistance in identifying the scientific names, common names, and uses of flora present at Terra Verde Ecofarm and Resort in Maragondon, Cavite last August 19-20. With him were Mr. Jhon Laurence B. Herrera of Sugar Palm Research, Information and Trade (SPRINT) Center, and Prof. Michele T. Bono and Prof. Dickson N. Dimero, faculty from the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS).

During the visit, plant identification and validation were done through collection of leaf samples and conduct of interviews with the locals. The identified plant species within the site were consolidated and will be used to educate its tourists in promoting conservation and proper utilization of these identified floras.

The activity was conducted under the signed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between Cavite State University (CvSU) and Terra Verde Ecofarm Inc. (TVEI) in partnership with CAFENR and CvSU Extension Services. (Jhon Laurence B. Herrera)

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NCRDEC hosts 3rd Coffee BREAK session

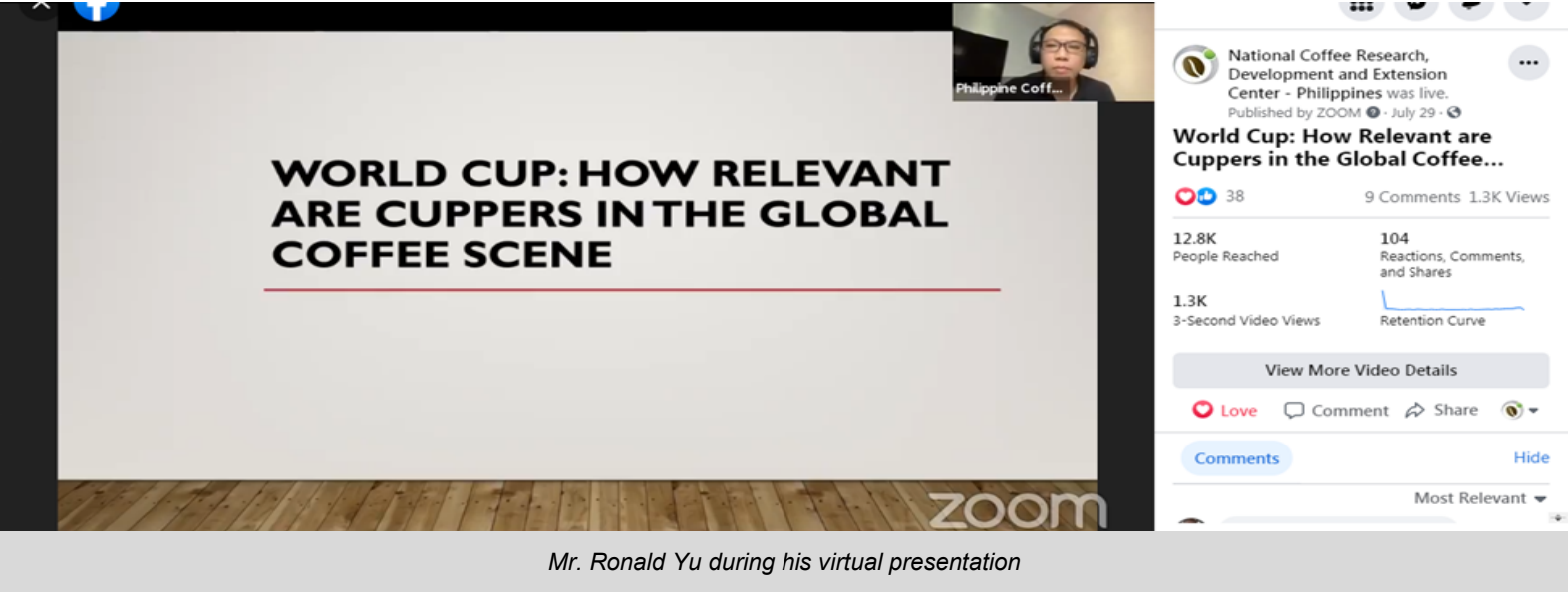
The National Coffee Research Development and Extension Center (NCRDEC) hosted the 3rd session of the 2021 Coffee BREAK Webinar Series highlighting coffee cupping, an essential procedure in assessing coffee quality and emphasizing the role of cuppers in the processing chain. The two-hour session was led by Mr. Ronald Yu, a certified Q grader and the president of the Philippine Coffee Guild, a nonprofit organization that envisions an inclusive, unified, and sustainable Philippine coffee quality, culture, and economy. He talked on “World Cup: How Relevant are Cuppers in the Global Coffee Scene”. The session aimed to provide an overview of the basic coffee cupping procedure and raise awareness on its importance to coffee stakeholders. The discussion was a mix of both technical knowledge and experience of the speaker himself.

“One relevance of cuppers is that they help the farmers

assess their coffee. Farmers devote most of their time in the field and they have to know at what level their produce is in the world coffee standards. Through cupping, our producers will be able to identify the defects in their coffee and will help them to improve their farming and post-harvest processing practices,” Yu said.

The Coffee BREAK session became a platform to introduce *Baryo Kape* Coffee Shop, a local enterprise which was established earlier this year and aims to bridge the gap between the coffee farmers and coffee enthusiasts. The enterprise is also one of the technology adopters of NCRDEC in terms of coffee processing.
