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BAELS extensionists continue to conduct English literacy program

The Bachelor of Arts in English Language Studies (BAELS) extension unit continued with its English literacy program for the students of Guyam Munti Elementary School (GMES) in November 2021. Virtual teaching was done via Google Meet.

The BAELS extension unit continued to guide and assist the teachers of GMES in the preparation of modules and conduct of virtual classes in Values Education, Filipino, and English Language subjects to Grades 4, 5, and 6 learners. Schedules were set every Thursday and Friday from October to December 2021.

In collaboration with GMES teachers who were still on a work-from-home (WFH) arrangement in November, the BAELS faculty used the DepEd prescribed learning materials and assisted the learners' parents and guardians on the use of cell phones and tablets in learning.

The sessions were made successful through the efforts and coordination of CAS-HELPS extensionists from the Department of Humanities. Ms. Jocelyn A. Legaspi, Ms. Ruby U. Matienzo,

The assessment-based intensive training, attended by ten farmers and owners of the farms, generally aimed to develop/elevate the knowledge and skills of the participants on the different coffee production technologies. Through this training, attendees were envisioned to be capacitated and equipped with right information on the proper way of establishing and managing a coffee plantation which they will soon apply as they establish their own.

The session started with an opening message from Engr. Gerry M. Castillo, CFVC project leader and NCRDEC director. A pre-test facilitated by the project team followed. Mr. Rodrigo H. Diloy, CvSU Education Program Specialist II and resource speaker, formally delivered his lecture on the methods of coffee propagation, establishment/management of coffee plantation, and management of coffee pests and diseases. The morning session was accompanied by a semi hands-on training as the speaker provided the participants with samples of different varieties of coffee cherries and leaves for characterization.

In the afternoon, Mr. Diloy together with the participants, visited the field for the demonstration of rejuvenation and pruning of old coffee trees. The participants witnessed how the old and unproductive coffee trees were brought back to their good shape. Farm owners were given insights on how they can apply these technologies in their farms. Moreover, they were trained on coffee propagation through the use of grafting and cutting.

The training ended with a post-test and short messages from Engr. Castillo and the farm owners. Prior assistance provided by the project were the provision of 500 liberica seedlings to the NFP Farm and conduct of site assessment at Canopy Farm. (*Gizelle D. Crema*)

Agritourism, Food and Culture." The history of the Municipality of Silang in terms of geographical locations, demography, climate, politics, and economy were presented. Moreover, Ms. Alma T. Maloles, Lead Customer Care Officer of Smart Communications, Inc. and baker at Silang Bakery, and Ms. Gredel Lovemae E. Matilla, former assistant chef at Ricky's All Day Grinn in Alberta, Canada and now a baking instructor, discussed the topic, "BAKING Delights" highlighting different baking tips and essential baking tools. Ms. Maloles described the different baking tools such as mixers, ovens, measuring tools, thermometers, pans, rolling pin, rubber scraper, mixing bowls, etc. She also introduced the use of alternative baking tools and equipment that can be normally seen in the kitchen. The project aims to help increase the number of action and basic research outputs of the faculty members of public junior and senior high schools. Its main activity is to deliver training sessions to develop teachers' skills and knowledge in statistics that will aid them in conducting researches.

The project was first launched in partnership with Constancio E. Aure Sr. National High School (CEANHS) in Mendez, Cavite that was conducted from December 2018 until February 2021 and offered 15 training sessions to the faculty members. With the success of its pilot implementation, several schools from Cavite sought the program leader's help to avail of the trainings offered by Let's START!

NCRDEC holds 6th Coffee BREAK webinar session

The National Coffee Research Development and Extension Center (NCRDEC) held the 6th leg of the 2021 Coffee BREAK webinar session titled, "Grounded: Employing Good Agricultural Practices in Coffee Production" last November 25 via Zoom Meeting software. The activity was led by Mr. Renjie Lucas, Senior Field Technician of the Agricultural Cooperative Development International / Volunteers in Overseas Cooperative Assistance (ACDI/ VOCA) Philippine Coffee Advancement and Farm Enterprise (PhilCAFE).

The session aimed to teach the participants with different techniques involved in Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) for coffee and its significance in improving the productivity of the local coffee farm highlighting the long term effects of sustainability in employing agricultural practices.

Mr. Lucas shared some of his experiences in the field as a technician. He mentioned that he was able to work with other cooperatives in different parts of the country. He discussed how he witnessed the development of different coffee farms by adapting sustainable practices.
