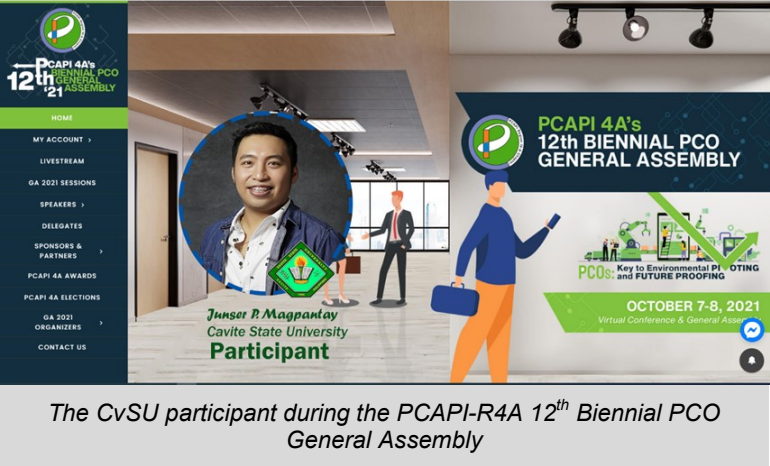
CvSU participates in the PCAPI-R4A 12th Biennial PCO GA

Cavite State University (CvSU), through the University Pollution Control Office (PCO) headed by Mr. Junser P. Magpantay, participated in the 12th Biennial Pollution Control Office General Assembly with the theme, “PCOs: Key to Environmental Pivoting and Future Proofing” held last October 7-8 via Microsoft teams. The assembly was organized by the Philippine Control Association of the Philippines – Region 4A

(PCAPI-R4A). It aimed to provide updates on the changes to environmental laws and regulations, and share knowledge and best practices of companies on pivoting against environmental, health pandemic or economic disruptions. A total of 352 participants attended the event.

During the GA, exemplary PCOs and companies were recognized as “Pivot Champions” wherein different awards such as 2021 Outstanding PCO, Success Story Award, and Mother Nature Award were given. Also, the general membership meeting which highlighted the virtual nomination and election of the PCAPI-R4A Board of Trustees was held. 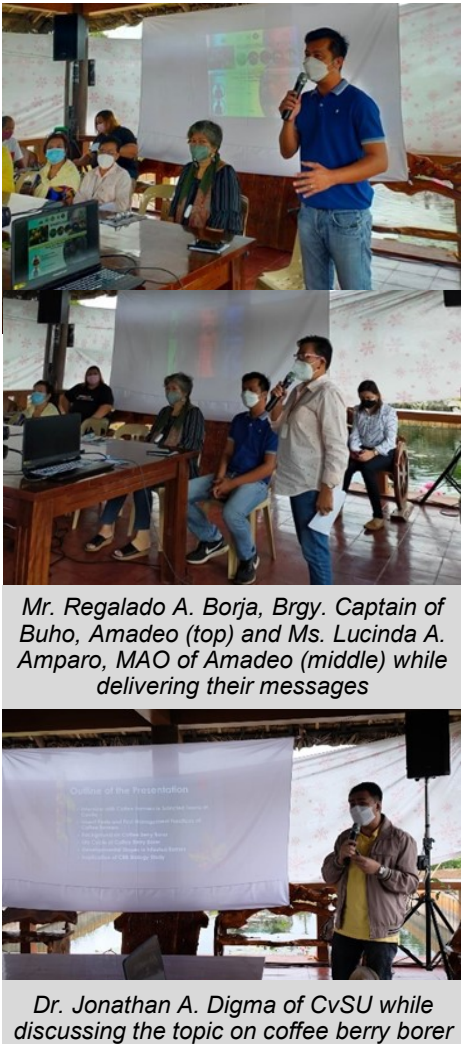

Dr. Jonathan R. Digma, faculty from the Department of Biological Sciences discussed the topic titled, “Biology and Life Cycle of Coffee Berry Borer and its Threat to Coffee Production” while Dr. Teddy F. 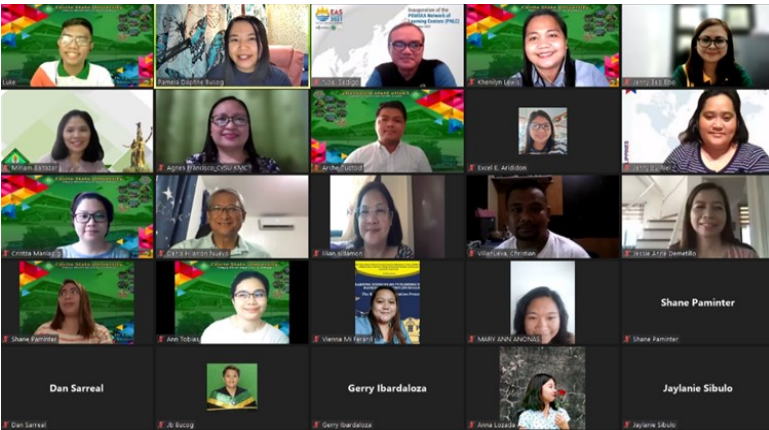
CvSU-TMC conducts 5th Faculty and 3rd Students Research Colloquium

Six colonies of stingless bees were established in Majayjay, Laguna last December 1 through the CvSU Bee Program in partnership with the Science for the Convergence of Agriculture and Tourism (SciCAT) project at Silan AgriFarm.

Assisted by Prof. Michele T. Bono and Prof. Dickson N. Dimero, technical experts from the CvSU Bee Program, the colonies were placed at Perry's Farm, Inc. managed by Mr. Jeffrey Mojica. Mr. Mojica was a trainee in stingless beekeeping training conducted at Silan AgriFarm last October 28.

Aside from bringing the bees, the team also shared tips on how to properly manage the colonies to avoid pests and other insects that may affect the productivity of the bees. They also visited two other locations and assessed the feasibility of establishing bees in the said areas.

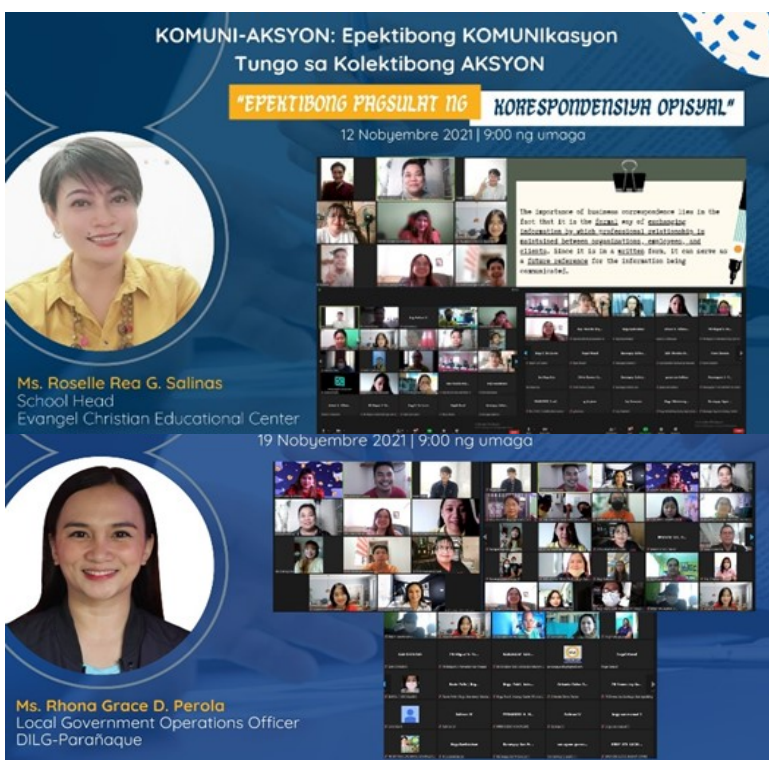

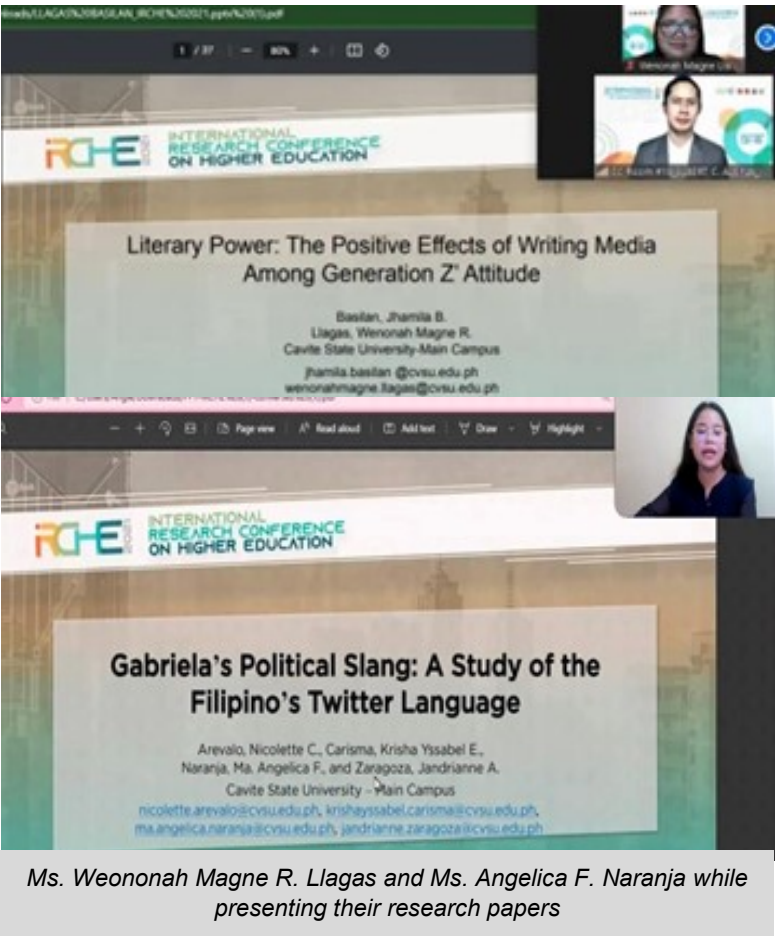

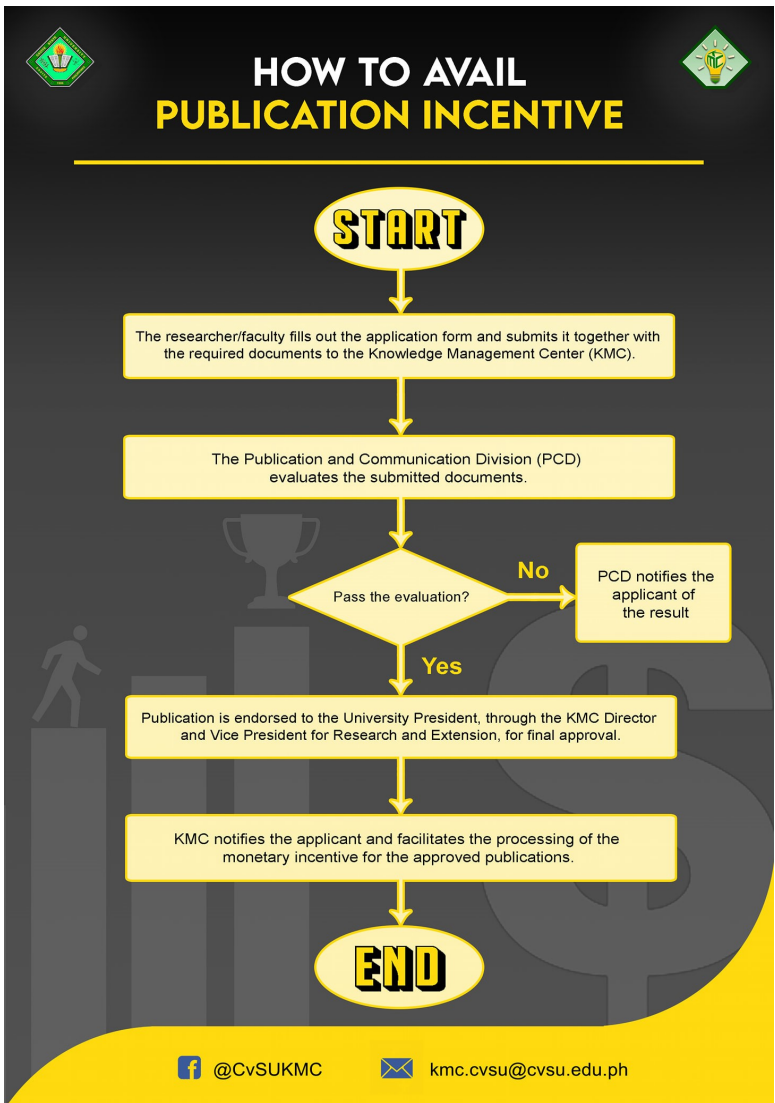
Manuscript Format and Submission

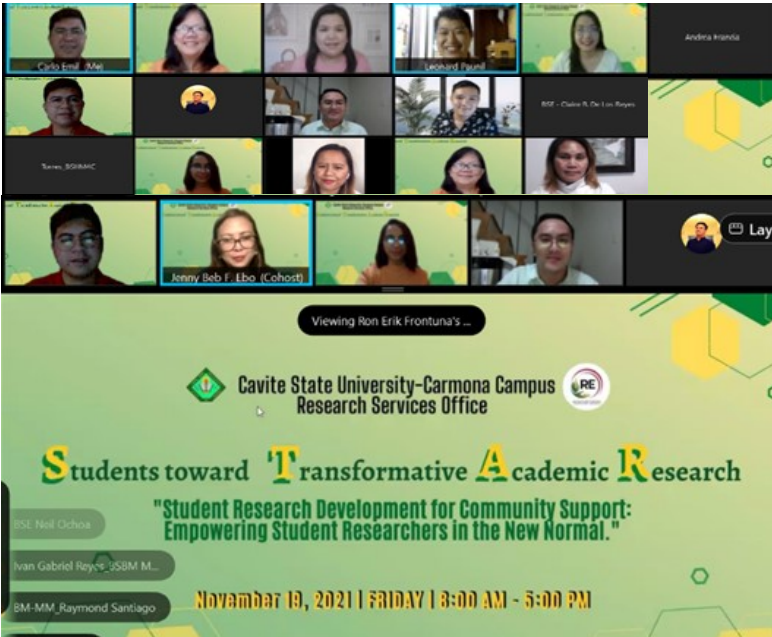
