

NAST, CvSU discuss DOST initiatives on Future Earth Philippines

The National Academy for Science and Technology (NAST) and the Cavite State University (CvSU) officials discussed the Department of Science and Technology's (DOST) initiatives on Future Earth Philippines (FEP) platform on December 23, 2021 via Zoom video conferencing.

FEP aimed to harmonize and integrate science-based efforts towards Philippine sustainability and resilience in connection with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SGDs). As mentioned, the country needs to increase its biocapacity and reduce the ecological footprint as the archipelagic nature and location of the Philippines make it susceptible to natural disasters such as typhoons and earthquakes.

The program to be facilitated in Region IV-A will be headed by Dr. Teddy F. Tepora as





education, research, development, and extension, was highlighted in the discussion. With this, CvSU, being one of the state universities that has a diverse ecological system and surrounded by bodies of water, was suggested to create a University-based Water Resource Center (UWRC).

Establishing a UWRC could harness and facilitate interdisciplinary and trans-disciplinary research and maximize the synergy between R&D and education while strengthening the quality of their academic outputs, faculty, and graduates in the water related fields, engineering, environmental sciences, agriculture and aquaculture, and other related fields.

Dr. Hernando D. Robles, university president, mentioned that during the strategic planning for research, development and extension agenda, 17 SGDs would be included in different research activities and initiatives. He added that the university has been involved in environmental protection and rehabilitation activities such as the Manila Bay Development Strategies since 2000. He also emphasized that the university will be in full support of the plans and activities for Future Earth Philippines.





Dr. Tepora while presenting the RAISE program during the inception meeting (left) and the RAISE IV-A Project Team (right)

This technique is best for homebased vegetable production and ideal for small spaces in urban areas.



The 8th webinar of the National Coffee Research, Development and Extension Center (NCRDEC) titled, "Perfect Blend: How Third Wave Coffee Upgrades the Consumers' Drinking Experience" concluded the 2021 webinar series of Coffee BREAK (Breakthroughs on Research and Extension for the Advancement of Knowledge of stakeholders) on December 29, 2021 via Zoom meeting.

Led by Mr. Gerald M. Lucas, Barista NCII Trainer, the final session of the webinar series highlighted the distinct feature of the third wave movement as being more focused on the art of brewing. He also discussed the different alternative brewing methods such as handheld espresso makers, French press, and pour overs as well as the different factors that affect the flavor of

the coffee drink, especially temperature and method of brewing.

Mr. Lucas emphasized the different details that consumers need to know when buying their coffee such as the variety, flavor notes, and place of origin. He also encouraged the audience to improve the quality of their daily caffeine beverage even through the use of small-scale coffee equipment.

With the aim of continuously promoting the local coffee enterprise, this session featured Brewed Down, a Cavite-based coffee enterprise that offers sweetened iced blended coffee drink.



Highlighted in the infographics were the Board of Regents (BOR) approved extension program with five projects, six trainings/seminars/webinars conducted with 772 participants, percentage distribution of the participants, percentage of satisfactory and higher ratings in terms of relevance, quality and timeliness, 16 distributed IEC materials with 3,163 recipients/ beneficiaries, three active partnerships, and one community needs assessment. Furthermore, the infographics included five extension projects currently being conducted by the campus including the projects' agenda classifications and the unit's Facebook page statistics.

These accomplishments were made possible with the support and efforts shared and extended by Ms. Melody N. Plaza, former campus extension coordinator; Ms. Joan L. Fortuna, Mr. Ron Erik C. Other winners in the said category were Tanza and Cavite City Campuses. (*Janine B. Bacosmo*)




CvSU-TMC launches book drive ...
