The College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) marked its 23rd founding anniversary with a simple virtual celebration attended by students, faculty, and staff of the College, and some members of the administrative council, on 11 February.

and **RES**iliency amidst Disruptions (**CAS CARES 2021**)", the one-day event kicked off with a program, with former chief justice of the supreme court, Hon. Maria Lourdes Aranal Sereno as keynote speaker.

Sereno, who was introduced by the dean of CAS, Dr. Bettina Joyce P. Ilagan, was warmly welcomed by the attendees. In her speech, she stressed that despite the disruptions, especially the major ones like natural and man-made calamities, there are still opportunities awaiting to achieve long-term change. According to her, we can continue to serve in times of disruption by taking into consideration the mandate of CvSU as a statefunded higher education institute, the mandate of every teacher of young people, and the mandate of the Filipino youth. "We cannot navigate 'disruptions' without a clear view or dream of the future. Disruptions can force us to change for the better, yet we must also minimize disruptions", she added. She particularly addressed the CvSU youth to imagine the nation, the Cavite, and the communities they want in the future. "If we have the fullness God promises, that is very much the life the Filipino youth can have – it is the most blessed and deeply peaceful life we can have - where deep inner prosperity is assured", she concluded.

## National Awareness Week for the Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation

In support of the Child Sexual Abuse Awareness Week, Cavite State University conducted a webinar entitled "We are the Solution: A Webinar on Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation" held on 25 February via FB Live. The activity was spearheaded by the Gender and Development Resource Center together with the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Education and College of Criminal Justice. The activity aims to raise the awareness of the public on the extent and magnitude of the problem, as well as the adverse consequences on the personality of the child, his/her family, and the society at large.

During the opening program, Ms. Sharon Mojica-Isip, Dean of the Office of Student Affairs and Services commended the efforts of the people behind the webinar. She encouraged the audience to apply all the learnings they will gain in their respective communities.

Atty. Jeffrey B. Bajita, a faculty member of the College of Criminal Justice discussed the Salient Features of RA 7610 "Special Protection on Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discriminate Act". Topics included in his discussion were: a. Who are Children; b. What is Child Abuse; What are Child Prostitution and Other Sexual Abuse; and When is there Attempt to Commit Child Prostitution. He ended his discussion with a bible verse, that "Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a reward from him. He emphasized that children should be protected or free from any form of abuse and discrimination" Psalm 12:3.

The next speaker, Ms. Darylyvy Ricafort-Avila, RSW, faculty member of the College of Arts and Sciences, explained the Protocol for Case Management of Child Victims of Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation. She further explained the flowchart for the case management.

The last speaker was Atty. Rhina May Sayarot-Elicano, of the City Schools Division, Dasmariñas City, Cavite was invited by the College of Education. Her topic centered on the Teachers' Awareness and School's Responsiveness to the Child Protection Policy. She thoroughly explained the important roles that the school administration together with the teachers play in addressing the needs of abused/neglected/exploited children. She also presented different programs and activities relative to child protection and ways to prevent the commission of acts of child abuse in the school.

The activity was attended by 1,314 female and 548 male students, faculty members, non-academic employees, and external clients from different agencies.



## Doctors are "necessities", medical school very important

The Department of Health CALABARZON Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo assured Cavite State University of his support and assistance as the University sets to establish a College of Medicine and offer Doctor of Medicine program in August of this year. Dr. Janairo believes that medical schools are very important to sustain human resource because "doctors are necessities, they should not be demanded. They should be present always".

During the collaborative meeting between CvSU and DOH provincial and regional officials, Dr. Janairo shared the landscape and development plans related to medical and health care services in CALABARZON and is confident that the establishment of a College of Medicine in CvSU will help fill in the gaps in human resource particularly those providing medical services for the 16.4 million people in the region. Meanwhile, Cavite Provincial Health Officer Dr. Nelson C. Soriano, emphasized the importance of the inclusion of public/community health in the curriculum.

For the part of the CvSU administration, Dr. Hernando D. Robles is keen on mobilizing resources to establish a Level III base hospital in the soonest time possible.

The CvSU College of Medicine aims to produce medical pluralist graduates with diverse knowledge and skills in providing health care to the community as well as professional physicians and ethical researchers with deep sense of duty and service.
