TGP, CFVC project teams conduct evaluation of potential MS in Bailen and Amadeo, Cavite

Both aiming to further boost the promotion of science-based information and technology services to the end-users in agriculture especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Techno Gabay Program (TGP) team of CALABARZON, with the assistance from the Coffee Food Value Chain (CFVC) project team of the National Coffee Research, Development, and Extension Center (NCRDEC), conducted the evaluation of potential Magsasaka Siyentista (MS) for the Farmers Information Technology Services (FITS) Centers of General Emilio Aguinaldo (Bailen) and Amadeo, Cavite on June 2 and June 21, respectively.

Mr. Liborio L. Ramos, 88 and an active member of Bailen Coffee Growers Association (BCGA), and Mr. Felix G. Angcao, 69 and the vice president of Minantok East Coffee Growers Association (MECGA), actively participated in the evaluation conducted by Ms. Lorna C. Dr. David L. Cero, dean of the College of Engineering and Information Technology (CEIT), delivered the opening message. He mentioned that sexual exploitation of children has been around for a long time and that it is now possible to do it from the comfort of one's home using a cellular phone or a laptop with an internet connection. He urged everyone to pay close attention to the speaker to increase awareness of OSEC. He complimented the GADRC and expressed optimism that the three E's (Engage, Equip, and Empower) would be met.

Ms. Ma. Sheila N. Estabillo, project manager of Safe Online Project, Plan International Philippines, discussed Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children and OSEC in the Philippines. She said that based on Time Magazine, the Philippines was formerly known as the world's texting and selfie capital. Furthermore, she mentioned that the Philippines is a "global hub" of live-streamed child pornography, with victims averaging 11 years old and offenders ranging from 40 to 72 years old from various nations across the world. She described the stages of sexual exploitation and stressed the red flags and signs to look for when someone has been sexually abused. She briefly reviewed the legal legislation pertaining to sexual exploitation and gave online safety tips using the acronym PIBST, which stands for privatized account, ignored inappropriate messages, blocked people, screenshot proofs, and talked to a trusted adult or authorities.

Dr. Famela Iza Cabe-Matic, dean of the College of Criminal Justice, delivered the closing message. She stated that it is a very timely and significant topic and worthy to note that the number of participants attending indicates that they are ready, willing, and interested in advancing any types of intervention against OSEC which can be considered as digital or online pandemic.
