The three-day training workshop kicked off with the

The National Coffee Research, Development, and Extension Center (NCRDEC) visited the Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology's (NEUST) in Gabaldon, Nueva Ecija on October 24 to 27 to conduct a four-day activity that include a site assessment and a lecture series on coffee production, in support of the implementation of NEUST's on-going extension program titled "Coffee Production, Processing, and Commercialization."

Dr. Rachael Moralde, VP for Research, Extension, and Training; Dr. Marivic Villegas, director of the NEUST Extension Services; Ms. Lorna Patoc, director of the Gabaldon Campus, and Mr. Junil Constantino, NEUST faculty, welcomed the team at the Gabaldon Campus.

Prior to the provision of skills training on coffee production, the team first conducted the site assessment of two coffee production and extension farms located in the Gabaldon campus. A total of 20 soil samples were collected from the area, which will then undergo a soil analysis. After this, the initial results of the site assessment were discussed by the team with the campus heads and their coffee

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farmers should continuously improve their way of doing things. “Hindi natatapos sa training ang adoption ng mga new technologies, but it takes consistency among our farmers and their organizations.” Ms. Valerio said, as the training reached its conclusion.

Consequently, the TOT provided practical discussion on integrated pest and disease management (IPDM), disease and nutrient deficiency identification, and use of natural biocontrol agents such as the *Beauveria bassiana*, which is deemed effective in naturally controlling infestation of coffee berry borer (*Hypothenemus hampei*).

Engr. Gerry Castillo, director of NCRDEC, welcomed the participants composed of producer-organizations from various parts of Regions IV and VI. The participants were from Aga Farmers Multipurpose Cooperative, Don Salvador Benedicto Integrated Social Forestry Farmers Federation, Juan Santiago Agriculture Cooperative, Guinayangan Coffee Growers Association and Farm Entrepreneurs, Asosasyon ng Responsable at Organisadong Magsasaka, Bakbak Coffee

Growers Association (formerly Samahan ng mga Magsasaka ng Bakbak Cuyambay, San Andres, Tanay, Rizal), LGU representatives from Quezon Province, and the new-comer, Varacco, Inc.

The TOT provides leeway to assess whether farmers have knowledge gaps that need to be addressed. It engages them in a dialogue among other coffee farmers to gain more practical insights on coffee establishment, production, harvesting, processing, and marketing. It is a rigorous workshop that seeks to develop potential coffee mentors by equipping them with accurate information, relevant technologies, and appropriate techniques.

Each coffee mentor will work closely as resident expert among their organization pass on information that enables them to create solutions to their problems, address differences in order to achieve consensus, and build networks for expansion and other opportunities. (Nathalie Angel D. Benipayo)

He discussed the following topics: Nature of Classroom Action Research, Parts of Classroom Action Research (DepEd Format), and the Guidelines in Writing a Classroom Action Research. Meanwhile, Prof. Jojo M. Villamin, president of the Philippine Association of Marketing Research Educators (PAMRE), was invited to be the speaker in the afternoon session. CEMDS holds iLearn, iTeach: Training-Workshop on Research Proposal Writing cum Module Preparation

The Research Services Unit of the College of Economics, Management, and Development Studies facilitated a three– day training workshop titled “iLearn iTeach: Training Workshop on Research Proposal Writiiing cum Module Preparation”, which was held last September 6 to 8 at the Gender and Development Resource Center, Cavite State University, Indang, Cavite. This activity intended to provide familiarization with the how’s of research proposal preparation, incorporate gender and development and the use of basic statistical tools and techniques in the preparation of research proposal and its conduct, and apply the principles and in turn produce modules that can be used in teaching research courses as well as submit research proposals. A total of 35 faculty from the college attended this in-person event.

Dr. Tita C. Lopez, dean of the college, welcomed the participants of the training-workshop. She likewise articulated her sincerest appreciation to the discussants for imparting additional knowledge on research proposal preparation stressing the importance of gender and development, module design, and the use of basic statistical tools and techniques. Meanwhile, Ms. Sherrie Rhose M. Rupido, research coordinator of the Department of Economics, explained the mechanics of the workshop. It was expected that after the training-workshop, the participants would be familiar with the research proposal preparation, apply the principles learned, produce modules that may be used in teaching research courses, and submit numerous research proposals.

The program was divided into several parts, which focused on: (a) module preparation; (b) research proposal writing; (c) gender and development; (d) quality procedures on research; and (e) statistical tools and techniques.

Mr. Gener T. Cueno, one of the faculty of the college who also serves as one of the members of the Textbook Board, discussed the technicalities of module preparation which included its parts and the contents of each. This presentation was immediately followed by a series of lectures on the methods of writing a research proposal, which integrated topics on writing the introduction, the review of related literature, and

the methodology as highlighted by Dr. Liane Vina G. Ocampo, Imus Campus faculty, who served as the resource speaker.

The second day of the training-workshop focused on gender and development, which was presented by Mr. King David G. Agreda, one of the focal persons of the Gender and Development Resource Center and faculty of Cavite State University – Cavite City Campus. He emphasized the relevance of considering gender and development issues in the research proposal writing and module preparation as well as the evaluation of research proposals including the Harmonized GAD guidelines as a vital contribution in gender mainstreaming. In addition, the afternoon session was devoted to discussing the different processes governing the research funding opportunities as provided by the college and the university as well.

Meanwhile, a sequential presentation of outputs was conducted after the talk. Ms. Danikka A. Cubillo, Dr. Glenda S. Pena, Ms. Sherrie Rhose M. Rupido, and Asst. Prof. Maria Isolde R. Sustrina, CEMDS faculty, presented their outputs based on the guidelines provided during the discussion of module preparation and research proposal writing.

The last day dealt with the use of various statistical tools and techniques shared by Mr. Jerome L. Buhay, faculty of the De La Salle University-Dasmarias. A series of presentations on the proper application of a number of statistical tools such as but not limited to descriptive and correlational analyses and a glimpse of predictive tools was discussed. He also made emphasis on the use of Jamovi as an effective software by performing an actual demonstration using sample data sets.

Ms. Sheryl S. Ersando, chairperson of the Department of Development Studies, finally delivered the closing remarks and thanked the participants of the event. (Mary Grace A. Ilagan)

Cavite State University-Carmona Campus participated in the IP Unite 2022 for Patent Search and Patent Drafting Workshop last November 16 – 18 at the Country Chateau Hotel, Tagaytay City. The event was made possible through the efforts of the Office of the Vice President for Research and Extension (OVPRE), Knowledge Management Center, together with the CvSU IP TBM. The workshop aimed to train researchers in conducting intensive patent searching and enhance their patent drafting skills. It also aimed to help the academe to determine if their technology and research would be patentable, and provide knowledge in drafting a patent application.
