BLEND has been organized by the Department of Biological Sciences since November 2023. It looks





NCRDEC hosts 2023 CALABARZON Coffee Expo

The National Coffee Research, Development and Extension Center, through the DOST-PCAARRD funded project titled "Enhancing the Coffee Food Value Chain Through Smart Technologies and Partnerships Towards Food Resiliency in Regions IV-A and B (CFVC)", served as the forerunner of the CALABARZO Coffee Quality Competition (CCQC) and the first-ever CALA-BARZON Coffee Expo (CCE) for 2023. The activity was held in partnership with the Filipino Coffee Institute (FCI), the Department of Trade and Industry Region IV-A (DTI IV-A), and the Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office IV-A (DA-RFO IV-A).

From December 4 to 8, the 20 submitted coffee samples for the CCQC were assessed by the esteemed set of coffee evaluators led by Ms. Emeline Sabado, a licensed Q Robusta grader from the Filipino Coffee Institute (FCI). Her team consisted of Mr. Victor Bas, a master roaster from Curve Coffee Collaborators; Mr. Mario Macalalad of Magellan Commodities Incorporated; Mr. Andrew Juat of FCI, and Ms. Bettina Grace Belardo of Kaffe Belardo.

Moreover, the rigorous five-day competition encompassed the standardized process of green bean grading, roasting, and cupping - akin to the yearly Philippine Coffee Quality Competition. The coffee entries came from producers across the CALABARZON region, mainly from the target beneficiaries of the CFVC project. Thirteen coffee samples fell into the distinctive category of *Liberica* or *Excelsa* while the remaining 7 entries represented the Robusta category, showcasing the unique and diverse offerings of coffee flavor notes from the region.

Less than a week after the competition, the 3rd place for the Liberica/Excelsa special category was given to Mr. Carlo Sanz, a *Magsasaka Siyentista* from Panungyan, Mendez, Cavite. The 2nd place was secured by Ms. Connie Gonzales of the Adarna Agriculture Cooperative, Candelaria, Quezon, while the champion (1st place) was handed to Ms. Tarcela Macalintal of the Pinagdanlayan Multipurpose Cooperative, Dolores, Quezon.

Meanwhile, for the Robusta category, the 2nd place was awarded to Mr. Eulalio Caisip of the Aga Farmers Multipurpose Cooperative, Nasugbu, Batangas. Mr. Carlo Sanz was hailed as the champion in the said category.

The winning entries were later presented during the CCE 2023, which

was held at the Cavite State University – International Convention Center. The expo served as an avenue for a timely discussion on attaining the best coffee quality as well as opportunities, such as the DA-ACEF program, that may be explored by coffee key players.

The culminating event was attended by Dr. Reynaldo V. Ebora, DOST-PCAARRD Executive Director; Dir. Noel A. Catibog, DOST-PCAARRD Technology Transfer and Promotion Division Director; Mr. Ruben Perlas, DA-RFO IV-A Agricultural Program Production Coordinating Officer, and Engr. Gilda de Jesus, DOST Cavite Director.

Moreover, Dr. Gerald Glenn F. Panganiban of Bureau of Plant Industry, through Ms. Sharene Samana, Chief of the National Plant Quarantine Services Division, graced the ceremony as the guest of honor. Dir. Juliet Lucas, National Coffee Focal and Director of DTI- CAR, gave her keynote address virtually, Dir. Emelita P. Bagsit, DOSTwhile CALABARZON Regional Director, also virtually signified her support for the activity. As this year's inaugural CCE highlighted the concept of redefining the region's coffee sector, a technology forum was facilitated by Ms. Rosario Cruz, CEO and manager of the (continue on page 6)

problems of the beekeepers in the Philippines to improve Philippine Beekeeping. In addition, CvSU, through the BRITE Center and the DA-BAI, is in the process of checking and revising the Memorandum of Agreement to formalize its collaboration to promote beekeeping in the Philippines.


Ms. Cruz mentioned, "While it may be challenging to compete with neighboring countries in terms of production, the growing interest in the varying flavor notes and distinct sensory attributes of Philippine coffee may be considered a competitive edge." Ideally, the yearly conduct of the CCQC on top of the CCE might just become a revolutionary way for farmers to harness the full potential of their production, aspire for better coffee quality. and integrate modern agricultural practices to ensure tainability. As Director Ebora envisions, "Kapeng Barako should not be confined to geographical boundaries."

As various agencies commit to providing support for the conduct of CCQC in the years to come, this undertaking will mark the pursuit of a shared interest in propelling the coffee industry forward.

With all of these, a new gaze in the Southern Tagalog Brewscape is set towards a renewed identity for CALABARZON, allowing its recognition as a flourishing center for coffee commerce.

The fourth year students of the Bachelor of Agricultural Entrepreneurship from the College of Agriculture, Food, Environment, and Natural Resources (CAFENR), guided by Dr. Adolfo C. Manuel, and in collaboration with the BRITE Center, conducted a seminar titled "BEE THE ONE: A Deep Dive Into Stingless Bee Farming" on December 15, 2023 at the Veranda Hall, Hostel Tropicana, Cavite State University, Indang, Cavite. The training aimed to give the participants from the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR) farmers some possible additional sources of income, and strengthen their knowledge about agripreneurship.

During the said training, Prof. Michele T. Bono, resource speaker, discussed various topics such as bee biology, basic beekeeping techniques, bee product development, management of stingless bees, economic opportunities, and issues and concerns on beekeeping.

After her talk, some participants expressed their willingness to try stingless beekeeping for pollination of their crops and honey and pollen production since stingless bees are proven to be good pollinators of important crops and vegetables in the Philippines.



Dr. Lloyd Balinado, chair of the Department of Biological Sciences, joined the 4th Philippine Herbal Summit sponsored by the UP Manila's Institute of Herbal Medicine on January 18-19, 2024 at the Sheraton Manila Bay Hotel. With the theme "Securing the Health of the Filipino Family through Philippine Herbal Medicines", the event invited several experts and researchers in the field of herbal medicine from all over the country.

The summit was held to provide a good opportunity for experts and re-

searchers to collaborate and share knowledge, with a vision to integrate herbal medicine into the pursuit of universal healthcare.

Among these distinguished participants was Dr. Balinado who was initially one of the sixteen selected poster presenters and one of the five who moved forward to orally present their groundbreaking studies. He got 4th place for presenting the findings of his study titled, "Unlocking Abaca's Medicinal Potential: A Closer Look at the Biosynthesis of Phenylpropanoids

in Abaca Fiber Processing Wastes". He discussed the biosynthesis of phenylpropanoids present in Abaca fiber processing wastes and revealed their potential applications in herbal medicine. He also presented the advancements in utilizing natural resources for medicinal purposes.

His award is a statement of his commitment and dedication to contribute to the growing significance of research in herbal medicines necessary for various healthcare challenges.
